



Mystery Solved?




THE MYSTERY OF THE TOWER ON WHICH THE WINDMILL WAS BUILT

After years of speculation as to the use of the **tower** on which the mill was built, the mystery has, we think, been solved.

Dating from the early to mid 18th century, the perfectly square flint and brick tower with just one floor above the four symmetrical archways, (one on each side), has had many suggested uses. Was it a seacemark or a beacon, was it for storage of fleeces (over 1600 sheep were recorded on the farm in the early 1800's), a Quaker meeting place, a mortuary, a support for a water storage tank, a folly or a dovecote?

The latter idea was suggested several years ago by our local historian **Trevor Povey**, but discarded until a recent visit by **John Wingrove**, a miller from Lurgashall watermill, who was emphatic that that was its use and proceeded to forward the photo (*left*) of a French **dovecote** which unquestionably does, in many aspects, resemble 'our' tower.

In retrospect, with the old village comprised of the church, the farm, the manor house and workers' cottages, a plentiful food source of fresh eggs and meat would be very logical. Plus their droppings were known to be used as a fertiliser. As to whether or not we will ever know conclusively is highly unlikely but it does appear that the mystery has been solved. *Peter Hill*
